A Read the text and answer the questions. (8 points)

Coffee is made from the beans that grow in the fruits of the coffee plant. There are usually two beans in each fruit and the harvesting is done by hand. The word 'coffee' derives from the Arabic 'qahwah', a word which was used originally for wine, but which came to mean coffee. Coffee beans used to be chewed before it was discovered that they can be boiled in water to make a drink. Coffee drinking began in Arab countries in the 14th century and did not become common in Europe until the 17th century. In 1600 coffee was believed by some Christians to be the devil's drink. In Italy, Pope Clement VIII was urged by his advisers to consider the favorite drink of the Ottoman Empire to be part of the infidel threat. However, he decided to "baptize" it instead, making it an acceptable Christian beverage. At first, coffee was sold by chemists, but it had little impact until the first coffee shop was opened in 1652 and instructions about how to roast and grind the coffee were published. In 1657, the King tried to close coffee shops because they were reported to be noisy. In 1668, Edward Lloyd's coffeehouse opened in London and was frequented by merchants and maritime insurance agents. Eventually it became Lloyd's of London, the best-known insurance company in the world. Coffee today is grown and enjoyed worldwide, and is one of the few crops that small farmers in third-world countries can profitably export.


